Avoiding COVID-19 Vaccine Scams

Connecticut is in the process of distributing the COVID-19 vaccine in a phased approach based on guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Be on the lookout for scams that promise to provide alternate ways of securing the vaccine.



Scams to watch for:

- 1 You are asked to pay to get the vaccine
- You are asked to pay to get early access to the vaccine
- You are asked to pay to have the vaccine shipped to you

Protect yourself

- Do not give your personal information to unknown sources.
- Be wary of advertisements for the vaccine through social media, email, telephone calls, online, or from unknown sources.
- Any important information regarding the vaccine will come from a reputable source, such as the CDC or CT.gov.
